SPRING 2003**January 11, 2003: Writing Research Articles**

Writing journal articles: Selecting a journal - the anatomy of a research article - avoiding common mistakes in manuscripts - determining authorship - ethical issues.

20 steps to a publication: A step-by-step process for developing an idea into an article - dealing with writer's block and other writing problems - submitting the paper - responding the review.

Presenting your data: Designing effective tables and figures.

February 15, 2003: Grantpersonship

Components of the application: The different sections of fellowship and research grant applications, and what goes into them - designing saleable specific aims and hypotheses presenting the research plan - developing a budget. The process of obtaining funding: Talking to program officers - preparing the application - maximizing your chances - the evaluation process - re-applying.

Break-out sessions on applying to specific funding agencies: Gain the insights of individu who have served as reviewers for agencies including NIH, NSF, DOD, Department of Education, private foundations, and more!

March 22, 2003: Creativity and Intellectual Property
